Rules

- **Who Can Participate?** The 2017 Poster Contest is open to all students in grades K-12. Students in public, private or home school.
- Any media may be used to create a flat or two-dimensional effect (paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, stickers, paper or other materials on regular posters (no computer only special category) Poster size must be between 8.5" x 11" and 22" x 28".
- Posters should be packaged so they remain flat when sent for judging.
- All posters must be created by an individual student rather than a team of students.
- The 2017 Stewardship theme “**Healthy Soils are Full of Life**” must be included on each poster submission to be eligible for the national poster contest.
- A signed and legible entry form must be secured to the back of poster to be eligible for judging.
- Although younger students will most likely receive help in planning from parents or teachers, NACD encourages each student to do as much of the work as possible by him/herself. Entries completed by students in their handwriting and coloring will score better than those designed, drawn and colored by adult assistance.

Poster Evaluations

The posters are evaluated on the following criteria:

- Conservation message (50 percent)
- Visual effectiveness (30 percent)
- Originality (10 percent)
- Universal appeal (10 percent)



Prizes

- Cuyahoga Soil and Water Conservation District Prize: Prizes awarded for 1st and 2nd place
- State winners will be eligible for NACD National Poster Contest and prizes.
