
Recently, the Village hosted our "Gas Versus Battery" event at Lang Pavilion. We had a good turnout as residents saw first-hand the benefits associated with the use of batterypowered lawn equipment. Together we can make a difference and help to reduce noise pollution in our Village. Batterypowered leaf blowers and weed trimmers are significantly quieter when compared to their gas counterparts. Additionally, there is no need to mix fuel and attend to many of the maintenance issues that gas-powered units require. If you use a landscaper you can still help. Consider the purchase of a batterypowered leaf blower and leave it out when you are scheduled for maintenance. Homeowners can request that their leaf blower is used for general cleanup after the lawn is serviced. We hope that many residents will make the switch to battery-powered units. My family has made the switch and the reduction of noise levels in our yard has been significant. I'm happy to take phone calls or answer emails if anyone is interested in learning more about this switch.

Our Road Program starts this month and will feature many improvements throughout the Village. Many residents contact me regarding the condition of their road surfaces. It must be noted that we don't approach this maintenance in a haphazard manner. Each year our 5-year plan is updated as winter takes its toll on the asphalt. In the spring, our Engineer drives the entire Village and updates road condition rankings based on several factors including, but not limited to, safety and traffic volume. These rankings are then used to prioritize improvements in a fair and equitable manner. This year we are spending 1.8 million dollars on our roads. This includes the resurfacing of Chagrin Boulevard and several side streets throughout the Village.

Members of our Charter Review Commission are working hard to review our Village Charter and suggest any changes they feel are necessary. This Commission is made up of volunteers and is chaired by resident Trina Gigax. Any suggested changes will be evaluated and considered by your Village Council. Upon consensus, Council may then vote to forward some or all of these suggestions for your consideration in the next general election. Special thanks to all of the residents who are helping out with this process.

Members of our Parks Commission are working hard to prepare for our annual "Head for the Hills" event this fall. Looking to set a healthy goal? Consider preparing for this 5k run/walk and enjoy one of the most beautiful courses in the Chagrin Valley. In addition to this run/walk, we will feature a hike, kids' activities and more.

I look forward to seeing many of you at one of our events and wish you all a happy and safe July.



ORDINANCES & RESOLUTIONS

The following Ordinances and Resolutions were passed in June:

ORDINANCE 2022-32

Amends Section 1171.11, "Supplemental Regulations for Certain Uses" to delete Subsection1177.11(g), "Solar Energy Systems," amend Schedule 1177.07, and enact new Chapter 1367 "Solar Energy Systems" of the Codified Ordinances of the Village of Moreland Hills to remove the requirement for a conditional use certificate for solar panel installation. Placed on First Reading as amended and Referred to the Planning Commission.

ORDINANCE 2022-33

Authorizes the Mayor to enter into a contract with Chagrin Valley Paving, Inc. for the Chagrin Boulevard Resurfacing Project in the amount of \$794.437.00.

RESOLUTION 2022-34

Adopts the alternative tax budget for the fiscal year 2023.

ORDINANCE 2022-35

An appropriations ordinance, which is a monthly financial housekeeping item.

ORDINANCE 2022-36

Authorizes the Mayor to execute the Community Funding and Escrow Agreement for the modernization of the Chagrin Valley Fire Department Fire Station.

Chipping Week - July 18-22

The Service Department will chip branches and sticks on your street. The branches should be cut into 4-foot lengths and stacked, in small bundles, facing the same direction; they DO NOT need to be tied. Piles with crisscrossed branches and anything over 5 inches in diameter WILL NOT be chipped. THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. Please have the bundles stacked by the side of the road by 7:00am on July 18; the Service Department will chip them over the entire week. Please note: per Village Ordinances, the first 15 minutes will be provided without a charge. Any additional time needed for chipping will be charged at a rate of \$30 for each 15 minutes over the allotted time.

FIREWORKS PROHIBITED IN MORELAND HILLS

Moreland Hills Council recently "opted out" of an Ohio law that allows residents to discharge consumer grade fireworks on certain dates throughout the year.

Please be advised that the discharge of fireworks is **still prohibited** in the Village of Moreland Hills 365 days a year. Licensed commercial vendors are still permitted to discharge fireworks under the guidance and approval (requires permit) of our local Fire Marshal.
