MESSAGE FROM MAYOR ETHAN SPENCER

I hope everyone is enjoying this warm and dry start to the summer season. The weather cooperated for our Community Fishing Day event on June 10, and the turnout was spectacular. It was so much fun seeing the excitement on the kids' faces as they pulled fish from the pond. Many awards were earned in several categories. A big thank you to Chief Todd Dietzel, Officer and Primary Organizer Gary Byers, and all the police and service employees for their work on this event. Can't wait to do it again next year!

This month I have two topics to cover in my message to residents. First, we are launching a RESIDENT SURVEY because we want to hear from you. It has been seven years since the last survey, and a lot has changed since then. Please take a few minutes over the next month to tell us what you think about how we are doing as a village. We need to hear from as many residents as possible so that we can get an accurate pulse of what residents like, and what they would like to see changed. The survey is completely anonymous, but we have several opportunities for you to provide your own freeform comments throughout the survey. If you wish to identify yourself so that we can follow up with you directly, please do so. Someone will get back to you if you request it. For details on how to access the survey, please see the feature box to the right.

Second, following up on my mention of cul-de-sacs and right of ways last month, I worked with our Service Department to put together a summary of our maintenance approach for these areas. Did you know that there are 47 cul-de-sacs in Moreland Hills? Six are on private roads, so the Village does

not provide maintenance for these. But the other 41 are part of our Service Department's responsibilities. Each cul-de-sac is cut and trimmed every 7 to 10 days during the growing season. In addition, periodically we will edge and mulch any planting beds that may be on them. At that time, we plan to do light pruning of bushes and trees, topsoil/ seeding repairs, and berm repairs where needed. We expect to be able to rotate through nearly all the cul-de-sacs over the course of the year. The Village does not regularly fertilize cul-de-sacs due to cost limitations, but if residents want to take on this task, we have allowed this in the past. Two examples of where this is happening now are in the Quail Hollow area, and on Cotswold Lane. Please call our Service Department if this is of interest to you (440-248-1188.)

The Village sticks with basic plantings in order to minimize maintenance costs. We have put our cul-de-sacs on a four-year rotation to evaluate whether new trees, grasses, or shrubs are needed. Should residents desire more customized or elaborate landscaping, the Village requires a written agreement that commits the homes involved to take on the maintenance costs of those areas. In addition to the 41 cul-de-sacs, our Service Department cuts and trims seven open space properties, four treatment plants, and 17 roadside areas every other week. 

The Service Department will chip branches and sticks on your street. The branches should be cut into 4-foot lengths and stacked, in small bundles, facing the same direction; they DO NOT need to be tied. Piles with crisscrossed branches and anything over 5 inches in diameter WILL NOT be chipped. THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. Please have the bundles stacked by the side of the road by 7:00am on July 17; the Service Department will chip them over the entire week. Please note: per Village Ordinances, the first 15 minutes will be provided without a charge. Any additional time needed for chipping will be charged at a rate of \$30 for each 15 minutes over the allotted time.
